## THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

## THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN REGULATION) LAW.

CAP. 124.

## PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Law:

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus and, while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose ex animo to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, they have undertaken that, if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 8 of the Missionary, Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names,
