THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL  
POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

REVOCATION OF ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE  
REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor hereby revokes the Order made by him under Defence Regulation 64 and published under Notification No. 379 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 10th May, 1956 (as extended by Notification No. 1165 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 29th November, 1956), without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL  
(ALIEN REGULATION) LAW.

CAP. 124.

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Law;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus and, while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, they have undertaken that, if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 8 of the Missionary, Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names,

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 1) 1957.**

**ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 60A.**

Whereas I consider it expedient in the interests of public safety to make a clearance order in respect of the land described in the Schedule hereto :

Now, therefore, I, the Commissioner of Famagusta, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 60A of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1957, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Clearance) (Famagusta District No. 1) Order, 1957.

2. The owners and occupiers of the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), and the agents of such owners and occupiers, are hereby directed—

- (a) to cut and clear away from the land all herbage, bush and undergrowth ;
- (b) to cut flush with the trunk and clear away the branches of all trees standing on the land other than fruit trees to a height of 12 feet from ground level ;
- (c) to prevent any herbage, bush or undergrowth on the land from growing higher than one foot and to maintain the land in a clean condition to the satisfaction of the Assistant Chief Constable, Famagusta.

**SCHEDULE.**

The area of land abutting on or lying within a distance of fifty yards from the following section of public road :—

From culvert No. 22/2 immediately to the west of Kondea Village westwards to the junction of Lysi by-pass with the old main road leading to Lysi, east of Lysi Village, on the Famagusta-Nicosia road.
