THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 20th September, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th October, 1956, under Notification No. 945 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor had authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order situated in the village of Platres, Limassol District (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorization for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 20th March, 1957, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW.

CAP. 266 AND LAW I OF 1953.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 141 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of paragraph (2) (the existing paragraph (3) being renumbered as paragraph (2)).

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Appendix A thereto and the substitution therefor of the following Appendix :—

“APPENDIX A.
(Regulation 141).

DIET SHEET FOR ALL PRISONERS AT THE CENTRAL PRISON
AS APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL SERVICES.

Item	Quantity
1. Cooking butter	10 drams daily.
2. Eggs	3 weekly.
3. Cheese or Hallouni	10 drams daily.
4. Meat with bone, fish with bone or minced meat	40 drams three times weekly.
5. Brown bread	195 drams daily.
6. Rice, macaroni, boulgouri or vermicelli	20 drams daily.
7. Potatoes, carrots, kolokassi, pulles, beetroot or any other root vegetable	125 drams daily.
8. Cabbage, cauliflower, celery, lahana, spinach, marrows, lettuce, gylstiritha, cucumber or any other leafy vegetable	55 drams daily.
9. Louvi dry, fassolia, pakla kounnes, lentils, louvana, cow peas, peas, kreatofasoula or any other pulses, dry or fresh	25 drams daily.
10. Fruit or vegetable fruit, including tomatoes	100 drams daily.
11. Sugar	5 drams daily.
12. Tea	1 dram daily.
13. Salt	2 drams daily.
14. Olive Oil	15 drams daily.
15. Olives	15 drams daily.
16. Condensed milk	5 drams daily.”

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955.
LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 666 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th July, 1956, I do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Famagusta District No. 5) Order, 1957.

2. No Greek or Turkish Cypriot born on or after the 1st January, 1930, shall be out of doors within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Famagusta or the Assistant Chief Constable in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 25th day of February, 1957, and shall remain in force until further notice.
