## SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

### No. 33.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 17) 1956.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 49 (c).

#### JOHN HARDING,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 49 (c) of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 17) 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Restrictions on Departure from the Colony) Order, 1957.

2.—(1) No person shall proceed from the Colony to a destination outside it except under the authority of a written permit in the form set out in the Schedule hereto granted to him by the Chief Constable or by such police officer as may be authorized in writing by him in that behalf.

(2) Unless otherwise expressly specified therein, a permit granted under this Regulation shall remain valid until revoked by notice in writing to the holder thereof.

3. The provisions of paragraph 2 of this Order shall not apply to-

- (a) members of Her Majesty's Forces and their families domiciled outside the Colony;
- (b) foreign Consuls de Carrière duly accredited to the Government, and to the families of such Consuls;
- (c) members of a visiting force to which the provisions of the Visiting Forces Act, 1952, apply;
- (d) persons in possession of a written permit granted by, or on behalf of, the Political Officer, Middle East Forces;
- (e) persons in possession of a valid Air Movement Authority (Form 2767);
- (f) persons in transit through the Colony.
