DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 21.

- I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Interpretation Law, do hereby depute the person for the time being holding the office of Director of Commerce and Industry to exercise and perform on my behalf the power and duty of appointing Analysts and samplers under section 2 of the Agricultural Fertilizers Laws.
- 2. Item No. 1 of the Schedule as to delegation of authority, published under Notification No. 172 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of 19th June, 1947, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 27th October, 1955, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 29th October, 1955, under Notification No. 675 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Stroumbi (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 290 and 1164 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 12th April, 1956 and 29th November, 1956, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 26th April, 1957;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Gazette: Supplement No. 2A: 8.12.1956. Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorization for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 27th April, 1957, and the Order is so extended accordingly.
