

No. 607. THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS)
REGULATIONS, 1956.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE NO. 8000.

1. The proviso contained in lines 15 and 16 of Open General Import Licence No. 8000, published under Notification No. 412 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of 11th April, 1957, is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor :—

“ Provided that in all cases covered by this Licence payment for the goods shall be made either—

(i) in sterling, or

(ii) in the case of goods imported from a country whose currency is specified under the Exchange Control (Specified Currency) Order, 1957, or any Order amending or replacing the same, in the currency of such country ”

2. Item 14 of the First Schedule to the said Open General Import Licence is hereby cancelled and the following item substituted therefor :—

“ 14. WOOD, LUMBER, CORK, AS FOLLOWS :

(i) Fuelwood and charcoal Group 241 All items

(ii) Wood in the round or roughly squared Group 242 All items

(iii) Cork, raw and waste Group 244 All items ”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Licence but is intended to explain its general purport.)

1. Payment for imports under Open General Import Licence No. 8000 will by this amendment be permitted to be made in the currency of the exporting country where such currency is a “specified currency” under Exchange Control legislation.

2. The import of timber shaped or simply worked (including building timber of all kinds of wood) will by this amendment in future require a specific import licence.
