

thousand two hundred pounds (£21,200) at a rate of interest not exceeding four and a quarter per centum ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in fifteen equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
- (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the improvement of the water supply in the village.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

**THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)  
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.**

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 79B.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by paragraph (a) of Defence Regulation 79B of the Defence Regulations (as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, which continues in force under the provisions of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade Dispute (Cyprus Inland Telecommunications Authority) (Tribunal) (Amendment) Order, 1957.

2. Sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 5 of the Trade Dispute (Cyprus Inland Telecommunications Authority) (Tribunal) Order, 1957, is hereby revoked and the following sub-paragraph is substituted therefor:—

“(2) It shall be in the discretion of the tribunal to admit or exclude the public or the press from any of its sittings.”

**THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL  
(ALIEN REGULATION) LAW, CAP. 124.**

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Law;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus and, while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they

desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, they have undertaken that, if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 8 of the Missionary, Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names.

**THE MOTOR VEHICLES (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE)  
LAWS, 1954 AND 1957.**

DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 3 (4) (c).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 (4) (c) of the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Insurance) Laws, 1954 and 1957, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to declare the Cyprus Mines Corporation whose head Office in the Colony is at Skouriotissa in the District of Nicosia (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") to be exempted from the provisions of the said Laws, subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) the Corporation shall furnish to the Accountant-General, in such form as the Accountant-General may approve, a Banker's guarantee for the sum of fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000), which shall remain in full force during the period of the exemption granted by this declaration and which shall not be capable of being withdrawn unless three months' previous notice in writing of such withdrawal is given to the Accountant-General;
- (b) The exemption granted by this declaration—
  - (i) shall only subsist so long as such Banker's guarantee remains of full validity and effect;
  - (ii) shall only apply to such vehicles owned by the Corporation as are notified by the Corporation to the Accountant-General;
