THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

I. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Short title. Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 4) Regulations, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 3) 1959 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 4) 1957. Appointment and powers of Press Censors.	<ul> <li>New Regulation Substituted :</li> <li>24.—(1) The Governor may by warrant under his hand appoint one or more Press Censors and subject to any special directions by the Governor a Press Censor shall have the powers following :— <ul> <li>(a) to require any person intending to circulate in the Colony any newspaper printed outside the Colony to produce to him for censorship any issue of such newspaper before its publication or circulation, and to give such directions as to the publication or the circulation thereof as he may deem fit;</li> <li>(b) to suppress the circulation of any newspaper printed outside the Colony or of any issue thereof.</li> <li>(2) Any person who refuses or fails without reasonable cause to submit any issue of any newspaper to a Press Censor or neglects to carry out or disobeys any lawful requirement, direction or order of a Press Censor shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation and shall be liable on conviction to the penalties provided for in Regulation 75 of these Regulations.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
