ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Mallia to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22(a)(i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, I, the Acting Deputy Administrative Secretary, do hereby order as follows :--

1. The Improvement Board of Mallia (hereinafter referred to as "the Board "), shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds (£1,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :---

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
- (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the improvement of the village water supply.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 20th September, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th October, 1956, under Notification No. 945 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Platres, Limassol District (hereinafter referred to as "the land "), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Notification No. 302 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 21st March, 1957, the Order was extended for a further period of six months up to the 19th September, 1957;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :
