# ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 44.

In exercise of the powers vested in His Excellency the Governor by Regulation 44 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 3) 1958, and delegated to me by Notification No. 736 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of 26th November, 1955, I, Bertram John Weston, Commissioner of Nicosia, do hereby give notice that in the interests of public order and safety and for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, have taken possession with immediate effect of the premises specified in the Schedule hereto until further notice.

- 2. The use of the said premises for the requirements of Her Majesty's Forces is hereby authorized.
- 3. The authority using the premises in pursuance of this Order is entitled to do thereon or in relation thereto such acts as may be necessary for the purpose of their occupation.
- 4. The exercise of any right of way over the premises and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person whether by virtue of an interest in the premises or otherwise is hereby prohibited during the period this Order shall remain in force.

All that privately owned property situated in Nicosia District, Dheftera village, Plot No. 216, Sheet/Plan XXX.27, Block A, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia, and dated the 15th November, 1958.

## ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 39A.

Whereas I, the Commissioner of the District of Nicosia, am satisfied that the building described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the building") is a building which is being used by terrorists, now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 39A of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 5) 1958, with the approval of the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Forfeiture and Demolition) (Nicosia District) (No. 2) Order, 1958, and shall come into force on the 17th day of November, 1958.
- 2. It is hereby directed that the building specified in the Schedule hereto and its contents be forfeited.

#### SCHEDULE.

That part of plot 269, Block A, Tymbou village, appearing on Sheet XXX1/4 of the Government Survey plan, registered in the name of the Church of Ayios Georghios and consisting of two downstairs rooms, one garage, one staircase and upstairs rooms, shown in blue on the copy of the said plan signed by me and dated 17th November, 1958.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 6) 1958.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 60 (A).

Whereas I consider it expedient in the interests of public safety to make a clearance order in respect of the land described in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, the Commissioner of Nicosia, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 60A of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 6) 1958, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Clearance) (Nicosia District) (No. 4) Order, 1958.
- 2. The owners and occupiers of the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), and the agents of such owners and occupiers, are hereby directed:—
  - (a) to cut and clear away from the land all herbage, bush and undergrowth:
  - (b) to prevent any herbage, bush or undergrowth on the land from growing higher than one foot and to maintain the land in a clear condition to the satisfaction of the Area Commander, Nicosia;
  - (c) to cut flush with the trunk and clear away the branches of all cypress trees standing on the land to a height of twelve feet from the ground level, and of all fruit trees to a height from the ground level of six feet;
  - (d) to cut and clear away all eucalyptus and acacia trees or branches thereof save as may be exempted by the Arca Commander, Nicosia.

### SCHEDULE.

The area of land abutting on or lying within a distance of fifty yards of the following sections of public roads:—

- 1. The road from Kokkinotrimithia northwards to Mammari.
- 2. The road from Kokkinotrimithia northwards to Dhenia.
