## THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

## ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 666 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 19th July, 1956, I do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Famagusta District) (No. 56) Order, 1958.
- 2. No male Greek Cypriot within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto born between the 1st January, 1932 and the 1st January, 1944, shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Famagusta or the Assistant Chief Constable in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to :-

- (a) any member of the Executive Council;
- (b) any member of Her Majesty's Forces or of the Cyprus Police Force (which term for the purposes of this Order includes the Auxiliary Police Force and the Police Fire Service) and any Special Constable when on duty as such;
- (c) any person holding a summons to appear before a Special Court, established under the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1957, when proceeding to and from the Court in accordance with such summons;
- (d) any advocate in possession of a certificate issued by a Justice of the Special Court or by the Registrar of the Special Court, Nicosia, that he is briefed to appear in the Special Court on a specified date when such advocate is proceeding to and from such Court on such date.
- 3. This Order shall come into force on the 17th November, 1958.

The Municipal area of Famagusta town.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

From 0730 hours till 1430 hours daily except Sundays, and from 1700 hours till 0500 hours nightly.

The Curfews (Famagusta District) (No. 47) Order, 1958, is hereby revoked.
