(This Note is not part of the Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Open Import Licence which comes into effect on the 1st January, 1959 liberalises the import of a wide range of dollar goods which, in view of foreign exchange considerations, were hitherto restricted.

The import of many goods included in this Open Import Licence is subject to a permit under the hand of the Director of Agriculture or other appropriate Authority as the case may be. The fact that any such goods are included in this Open Import Licence does not mean that import will be permitted unless the importer holds the necessary permit from the Appropriate Authority.

NOTICE (No. 28) UNDER CLAUSE 3 OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by clause 3 of the First Schedule to the Defence (Importation of Goods) Regulations, 1956, I, the Director of Commerce and Industry, do hereby declare that the import into the Colony by any importer registered under the provisions of the Defence (Registration of Importers) Order, 1956, of the goods shown in the List hereunder from Yugoslavia, is hereby permitted without a written licence under Regulation 3 (1) (a) of the above named Regulations, subject to the following terms and conditions:—

(a) that the goods enumerated in the List hereunder originate in Yugoslavia and are imported from such country of origin;

(b) that payment for such goods shall be made in sterling, through banking channels; and

(c) that such goods shall be cleared from Customs on or before the 31st December, 1959.
