THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER 1946.

REVOCATION OF ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

THE EMERGENCY FOWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 5) 1957.

I, the Commissioner of Famagusta, in exercise of the powers vested in me by paragraph (1) of Regulation 38 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 5) 1957, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Protected Areas (Famagusta District No. 6) Order, 1958.
- 2. The area specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a protected area for the purpose of Regulation 38 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 5) 1957.
- 3. This Order shall come into force at 04.00 hours on Sunday, 2nd March, 1958, and shall remain in force until 18.00 hours on Sunday, 2nd March, 1958, unless revoked or extended by a supplementary order made under my hand.

The Municipal area of Famagusta and the main Famagusta-Larnaca road between the Municipal boundary and Four Mile Point.
