## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 3010

MADE UNDER SECTION 42.

8 of 1954 49 of 1955 19 of 1957 11 of 1958. In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 42 of the Customs Management Laws, 1954 to 1958, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Management (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) (Amendment) Order, 1958.

- 2. The Second Schedule to the Customs Management (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports Order), is hereby amended:—
  - (i) by deleting the word "lorries" which occurs in paragraph 1 thereof and substituting therefor the word "vehicles";
  - (ii) by inserting at the end thereof the following:-
    - "In this Schedule 'motor vehicle' means any mechanically propelled vehicle or any trailer drawn thereby, intended or adapted for use on roads and includes a trolley vehicle but does not include vehicles constructed exclusively for use on rails or other specially prepared tracks."
