THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Defence Regulation 64 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force pursuant to the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957), His Excellency the Governor makes the Order following :—

1. Subject to the restrictions and conditions contained in the First Schedule to this Order, the use of the land specified in the Second Schedule to this Order for the purpose of Her Majesty's Navy during the period from the date of this Order until the 31st day of January, 1959, is hereby authorised.
2. The persons using the said land in pursuance of this Order are entitled to do thereon or in relation thereto such acts as may be necessary for the said purpose.
3. The exercise of any right of way over the said land or of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person whether by virtue of an interest in the said land or otherwise, is hereby prohibited during the period this Order shall remain in force.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. The said land shall be occupied for the purpose of Her Majesty's Navy only.
2. At the expiration of this Order the said land shall be restored to the persons entitled thereto free of any erection, structure or construction erected or constructed thereon after the making of this Order.
3. Compensation shall be paid to persons having an interest in the said land for its use and occupation under this Order.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

All the area comprised in plot No. 132/1/1 on the Government Survey Plan No. LIV.52, Yermasoyia village and more particularly defined and delineated as the area coloured red on the plan subscribed by the A.D. Lands, Cyprus, and dated the 10th day of May, 1958, and deposited in the office of the Commissioner, Limassol.
