THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 1) 1958.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 44.

Whereas it appears to the Governor to be expedient in the interest of public order and safety to take possession of the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the land") and to authorise its use in the interest of public order and safety :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by regulation 44 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1958, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to take possession of the land and, in connection with the taking possession and making use of the land, has been pleased to direct and order as follows :—

- (1) The use of the land for the requirements of Her Majesty's Forces is hereby authorised.
- (2) The persons using the land in pursuance of this Order are hereby authorised to do, in relation to the land, anything which any person having an interest in the land would be entitled to do by virtue of that interest.
- (3) The exercise of any right of way over the land, and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person, whether by virtue of an interest in the land or otherwise, is hereby prohibited.

SCHEDULE.

All that privately owned property situated at Aya Trias Quarter, Limassol Town, Block No. 4 under plot No. 1 & 1/8 of Sheet/Plan LIV. 59.I.14.III, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Commissioner, Limassol, and dated the 2nd day of January, 1957.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 2nd December, 1955, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 8th December, 1955, under Notification No. 762 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Kakopetria village (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 470, 1164, 574 and 1050 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 7th June, 1956, 29th November, 1956, 6th June, 1957, and 28th November, 1957, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 1st June, 1958 ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :
