Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisation for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 9th June, 1958, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.

CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952, 43 OF 1955 AND 22 OF 1956.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 7.

Whereas by Notification No. 1036 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 1st November, 1956, the Governor declared the widening, improving and realigning of the public road between Nicosia and Larnaca to be an undertaking of public utility ;

And whereas the Commissioner of Larnaca in compliance with section 6 of the Land Acquisition Law, by a notice published under Notification No. 181 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 13th March, 1958, gave particulars of a portion of the lands required in connection with the aforesaid undertaking (hereinafter referred to as "the lands") ;

And whereas the Commissioner of Larnaca forwarded to the Governor the required recommendations, plan and particulars, no objections having been made ;

And whereas the Governor has approved the plan and particulars submitted, and has considered it expedient, having regard to the circumstances of the case, that the lands be acquired :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the Land Acquisition Law, the Governor hereby sanctions the acquisition of the Lands under the provisions of the said Law.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (NO. 1) 1958.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 39A.

Whereas I, the Commissioner of the District of Nicosia, am satisfied that the building described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the building"), is a building which is being used by terrorists, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 39A of the Emergency Power

(Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1958, with the approval of the Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Forfeiture and Demolition) (Nicosia District No. 1) Order, 1958.

2. It is hereby directed that the building and its contents be forfeited and demolished.

The lavatory standing on Plot No. 73/3 of Block 15, Ayia Sophia Quarter of Nicosia, of the Government Survey plan, which is situated in the District of Nicosia.

No. 365. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDERS, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE
REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulation 61 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, which continues in force under the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957, I hereby order as follows :—

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1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Antibiotics and other Therapeutic substances Control) (Amendment) Order, 1958, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Antibiotics and other Therapeutic substances Control) Order, 1954, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

**No. 366. CUSTOMS NOTICE TO IMPORTERS.
GOODS IMPORTED FROM HONG KONG.**

ADMITTANCE TO PREFERENTIAL RATES OF DUTY.

Importers of merchandise from Hong Kong are hereby notified that under section 199 of the Customs Management Laws, 1954 to 1958, in order that goods consigned from and grown, produced or manufactured in Hong Kong may be admitted to preference on import into Cyprus, collectors of Customs and Excise will in future require that, in addition to the ordinary combined form of invoice and certificate of origin, such goods are satisfactorily attested by a Public Accountant's certificate of Imperial Preference in the form of the Appendix hereunder,
