## No. 366. CUSTOMS NOTICE TO IMPORTERS. GOODS IMPORTED FROM HONG KONG.

ADMITTANCE TO PREFERENTIAL RATES OF DUTY.

Importers of merchandise from Hong Kong are hereby notified that under section 199 of the Customs Management Laws, 1954 to 1958, in order that goods consigned from and grown, produced or manufactured in Hong Kong may be admitted to preference on import into Cyprus, collectors of Customs and Excise will in future require that, in addition to the ordinary combined form of invoice and certificate of origin, such goods are satisfactorily attested by a Public Accountant's certificate of Imperial Preference in the form of the Appendix hereunder.
