

Republic of Germany, and when those ships are within the Colony,
and

- (b) nothing in the said section shall be taken to confer any power or impose any duty or obligation on any court or officer in relation to the apprehension, or conveyance on board his ship, of any deserter who satisfies that court or officer that he is :—
- (i) a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies or a Southern Rhodesian citizen or a British protected person ; or
 - (ii) a person in respect of whom there is reasonable ground for believing that his life or liberty will be endangered for reasons of race, nationality, political opinion or religion, in any country to which his ship is likely to go.

No. 438. **THE FOREIGN DESERTERS LAW.**
CAP. 272.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 2.

Notice is hereby given that section 2 of the Foreign Deserters Law shall apply in the case of the Italian Republic subject to the following limitations, conditions and qualifications, namely,

- (a) the said section shall only apply as respects seamen and apprentices who desert from ships registered at any port in the Italian Republic or in any territory for whose international relations Italy is responsible and when those ships are within the Colony ; and
- (b) nothing in the said section shall be taken to confer any power or impose any duty or obligation on any court or officer in relation to the apprehension, or conveyance on board his ship, of any deserter who satisfies that court or officer that he is :—
 - (i) a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies or a Southern Rhodesian citizen or a British protected person ; or
 - (ii) a person in respect of whom there is reasonable ground for believing that his life or liberty will be endangered for reasons of race, nationality, political opinion or religion, in any country to which his ship is likely to go.
