## THE INTERPRETATION LAW.

CAP. I AND LAWS 30 OF 1953, 19 AND 30 OF 1954.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 21.

Hugh Foot, Governor.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 21 of the Interpretation Law, I, the Governor, hereby depute the Inspector of Mines to exercise on my behalf all the powers which I am empowered to exercise under the provisions of the following sections of the Mines and Quarries (Regulation) Law and of the following regulations of the Mines and Quarries Regulations, 1958:—

(a) section 11 of the said Law;

(b) section 38 of the said Law, in so far as Quarry Licences Class B, as defined by regulation 17 (2) (b) of the said Regulations, are concerned; and

(c) Regulations 6, 7, 8, 9 and 18 (3) (4) and (5) of the said Regulations.

2. The delegation of authority published under Notification No. 241 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 7th April, 1955, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

# No. 952. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order as follows:—

- 1. Subject to the restrictions and conditions contained in the First Schedule to this Order, the use, for military purposes, of the land and property specified in the Second Schedule (hereinafter referred to as "the land") during the period of six months is authorized from the 3rd day of June, 1958.
- 2. The persons using the land in pursuance of this Order are entitled to do thereon or in relation thereto such acts as may be necessary for such military purposes.
- 3. The exercise of any right of way over the land and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person, whether by virtue of an interest in the land or otherwise, is prohibited during the period this Order shall remain in force.

### FIRST SCHEDULE.

- 1. The land shall be occupied and used for military purposes only.
- 2. At the expiration of this Order the land shall be restored to the persons entitled thereto free of any erection, structure or construction erected or constructed thereon after the making of this Order.
- 3. Compensation shall be paid to the persons having an interest on the land for its use and occupation under this Order.

### SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that area of privately owned land forming part of plot No. 92 of the Government Survey plan No. XIX.52.W., situated at Pendayia village, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Assistant Director of Lands, Cyprus, dated the 2nd June, 1958, and deposited in the office of the Commissioner, Nicosia/Kyrenia at Lefka.

# No. 953. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

Order Made by the Governor under Defence Regulation 64. In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. Subject to the restrictions and conditions contained in the First Schedule to this Order, the use, for military purposes, of the land and property specified in the Second Schedule (hereinafter referred to as "the land") during the period of six months is authorized from the 17th day of June. 1058.

2. The persons using the land in pursuance of this Order are entitled to do thereon or in relation thereto such acts as may be necessary for such military purposes.

3. The exercise of any right of way over the land and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person, whether by virtue of an interest in the land or otherwise, is prohibited during the period this Order shall remain in force.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. The land shall be occupied and used for military purposes only.

2. At the expiration of this Order the land shall be restored to the persons entitled thereto free of any erection, structure or construction erected or constructed thereon after the making of this Order.

3. Compensation shall be paid to the persons having an interest on the land for its use and occupation under this Order.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

The privately owned land situated in Yerolakkos village, Nicosia District, that is to say:—

(a) The land shown as Plot No. 390 of the Government Survey plans No. XXI.42.E.2 and XXI.43.W.2.

(b) The land shown as Plot Nos. 364 and part of 365 of the Government Survey plans No. XXI.51.W.1 and XXI.51.E.1.

All which said land is more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Assistant Director of Lands, Cyprus, dated the 9th June, 1958, and deposited in the Commissioner's Office, Nicosia.
