Whereas by Order dated the 16th March, 1956, and published under Public Instrument No. 215 of 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Ayios Nicolaos Quarter, Famagusta (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Public Instruments Nos. 969 of 1956, 219 of 1957, 818 of 1957, 161 of 1958 and 1007 of 1958, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 15th March, 1959;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 16th March, 1959.
