THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF KALOPANAYIOTIS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages 12 of 1950 (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improve-18 of 1950 ment Board of Kalopanayiotis hereby make the following bye-laws :-

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kalopanayiotis (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kalopanayiotis Bye-laws, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kalopanayiotis Bye-laws, 1951 and 1959.

2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :-

"26. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in the appropriate slaughter-house, that is to say : ----Mile

9. Bye-law 82 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor : ---

"82. The following tolls shall be paid by every person selling or exposing for sale in the fair market the following animals, goods, articles, things, eatables or liquids of any kind, that is to say : --

(a) For every camel, horse, mule or ox sold

hundred and fifty mils". 12. Paragraph (2) of bye-law 135 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "ten shillings" (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the words "five hundred mils".

13. Paragraph (2) of bye-law 136 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "five shillings" (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the words "two hundred and fifty mils".

"178.—(1) Whenever any authorized weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the authorized weigher upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of five mils for eash ten okes or part thereof and such authorized weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Board may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the authorized weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that the minimum fee for any weighing, measuring or testing shall be 5 mils."

19. Bye-law 179 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the model Bye-laws published in P.I. No. 132 of 1951) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "six piastres" in the third line and the substitution therefor of the words "thirty-five mils".

20. Bye-law 181 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :---

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that-

(a) Fractions under 2 mils shall not be collected ;

(b) For fractions of 2 mils and over and under 4 mils the sum of 3 mils shall be collected ;

(c) For fractions of 4 mils and over and under 5 mils the sum of 5 mils shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 5 mils".

No. 173. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAW. CAP. 252 and Laws 11 of 1950, 31 of 1951, 20 of 1953, 29 of 1954, 57 of 1954 and 14 of 1955.

Bye-laws made by the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Morphou,

P.I.: 231/1941 to 274/1958. In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Morphou hereby make the following bye-laws : —

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to 1958 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to 1959.

2. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 138B of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "a fee not exceeding three hundred mils" and the substitution therefor of the words "a fee not exceeding five hundred mils".

3. The Third Schedule to the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment No. 2) Bye-laws, 1955, the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1957, and the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1958, is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of item 27 and the substitution therefor of the following item : —
