## No. 208. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64. Whereas by Order dated the 19th Octobes, 1955, and published under Public Instrument No. 638 of 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Pano Platres (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months :

## No. 209. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

Order made by the Governor under Defence Regulation 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 11th April, 1956, and published under Public Instrument No. 307 of 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Chiftlikoudhia Quarter, Limassol Town (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;
