THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 23rd October, 1955, and published under Public Instrument No. 652 of 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Eylenja (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months :

And whereas by virtue of Public Instruments Nos. 291 of 1956, 1164 of 1956, 396 of 1957, 912 of 1957, 216 of 1958 and 791 of 1958, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 22nd April, 1959;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 23rd April, 1959.

Whereas by Order dated the 24th April 1956, and published under Public Instrument No. 331 of 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Pomos (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Public Instruments Nos. 1165 of 1956, 400 of 1957, 900 of 1957, 223 of 1958, and 793 of 1958, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 23rd April, 1959 ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 24th April, 1959.
