THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 18th April, 1956, and published under Public Instrument No. 330 of 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Pano Platres (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Public Instruments Nos. 1165 of 1956, 400 of 1957, 906 of 1957, 222 of 1958 and 790 of 1958, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 17th April, 1959 ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of one month as from the 18th April, 1959.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 9th April, 1956, and published under Public Instrument No. 306 of 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Kato Lakatamia (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Public Instruments Nos. 1165 of 1956, 400 of 1957, 911 of 1957, 221 of 1958 and 1014 of 1958, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 8th April, 1959 ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 9th April, 1959.
