THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

REVOCATION OF ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR
UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor hereby revokes the Order made by him under Defence Regulation 64 and published under Public Instrument No. 996 of 1958, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

THE BOMBARDMENT RANGE AREAS LAW.
CAP. 222 AND LAWS 23 OF 1951 AND 38 OF 1958.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Bombardment Range Areas Law, His Excellency the Governor hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bombardment Range Areas (Consolidation) (Amendment) Regulations, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Bombardment Range Areas (Consolidation) Regulations, 1957 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Bombardment Range Areas (Consolidation) Regulations, 1957 and 1959.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting regulation "19" therein and substituting therefor the following new regulation to be numbered "19" :—

"19. The signals to be hoisted in respect of the Goshi Bombardment Range Area shall be as follows :—

(a) By day—

(i) A red flag hoisted on the highest point of the high ground at the SOUTH-EASTERN boundary of the area.

(ii) Red flags hoisted on the approaches to the area at points on the map 1 : 50,000 Cyprus, Sheet 13, Larnaca, map reference 231488, 235475, 231455, 172509, 171508.

(b) By night—

Red lamps hoisted on flag poles situated as in (a) (i) and (ii) above."
