## THE SPECIAL COURT LAWS, 1955 TO 1959.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 3072

MADE UNDER SECTION 18.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by the proviso to section 18 of the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1959, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Special Court (Continuance) Order,
- 2. The Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1959, shall continue in operation for a period of six months from the 1st day of May, 1959, that is until the 31st day of October, 1959, and shall then expire unless continued in force for any further period or periods of six months by the Governor-in-Council, by Order published in the *Gazette*, under the provisions of the proviso to section 18 of the said Laws.

THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE RULES, 1953 AND 1954.

## DIRECTION UNDER RULE 9 (2).

P.I.: 249/1953 531/1954. Pursuant to the provisions of rule 9 (2) of the Criminal Procedure Rules, 1953 and 1954, I hereby direct that, with effect from the 1st of May, 1959, the service of all criminal process issued in criminal proceedings instituted by—

- (a) a Department other than the police or a District Commissioner; or
- (b) a Municipal Authority shall be effected by any officer in the employment of the Department or Municipal Authority which instituted the proceedings.

P.I.: 669/1954. The Direction dated the 17th November, 1954, and published as Public Instrument No. 669/1954 is revoked with effect from the 1st of May, 1959.
