THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

REVOCATION OF ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER
DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to revoke the Orders made by him under Defence Regulation 64 and published under Public Instruments Nos. 638 of 1955, 786 of 1955, 8 of 1956, 216 of 1956, 330 of 1956, 1041 of 1957, 93 of 1958, 325 of 1958 and 326 of 1958, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.
CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 22 OF 1956.

NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to establish a War Department Range and Field Training Area at Cape Pyla in the District of Larnaca (hereinafter referred to as "the undertaking") the cost whereof is to be borne by Her Majesty's War Department :

Now therefore in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare the establishment and operation of the undertaking to be an undertaking of public utility, and has been pleased to authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking under the provisions of the said Law, and has further been pleased to entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to Mr. P. G. C. Farrell, M.B.E., Assistant Director of Lands for the War Department in Cyprus.
