## No. 422. THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (EXPORT) REGULATIONS, 1956 AND 1958.

# NOTICE UNDER REGULATION 20 (b). Packing Specifications for Perishables.

P.I.: 47/1956 141/1958. In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 20 (b) of the Agricultural Produce (Export) Regulations, 1956 and 1958, I, the Director of Commerce and Industry, do hereby direct as follows:—

### PART I.—CITRUS FRUIT.

1. Citrus fruit of any type intended for export to any destination shall not be packed except in one of the following manners:—

(i) In new wooden cases conforming with the provisions of Regulations 5 and 40 of the Regulations, made of wood of the following thicknesses:—

(a) It made of pinewood:—			
End and centre partitions			16 mm.
Top and bottom staves	 	 	7 mm.
Side staves			8 mm.

(b) If made of beechwood:— ..

End and centre partitions .. .. .. 15 mm.

Top, bottom and side staves .. .. 4 mm.

(ii) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.

2. Oval Oranges shall be packed :-

(i) In "Large" cases, having an internal height of 30 cm., an internal width of 37 cm. and an external length of 74 cm., or

(ii) In "Standard" cases, having an internal height of 27, 28 or 29 cm.; an internal width of 34 cm. and an external length of 68 cm.; or

(iii) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.

3. Valencia Oranges, Round Oranges, Bitter Oranges and Grape-fruit shall be packed—

(i) In "Standard" cases, having an internal height of 27, 28 or 29 cm.; an internal width of 34 cm. and an external length of 68 cm.; or

(ii) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.

4. Oval Oranges having a circumference of 19 cm. to 28 cm. shall be packed—

(i) In "Large" cases with counts of 120, 150, 180, 210, 240 or 294. Count 120 shall be packed in four layers; counts 150, 180, 210 and 240 shall be packed in five layers; count 294 shall be packed in six layers.

(ii) In "Standard" cases with counts of 100, 120, 150, 180, 210 or 240.

Counts 100 and 120 shall be packed in four layers; all other counts

shall be packed in five layers;

- 5. Valencia Oranges, Round Oranges and Bitter Oranges having a circumference of 18.5 to 25 cm. shall be packed in "Standard" cases with counts of 100, 120, 150, 180, 210, 240 or 270. Counts 100 and 120 shall be packed in four layers; all other counts shall be packed in five layers;
- 6. Grapefruit having a circumference of 24 cm. and over shall be packed in "Standard" cases with counts of 64, 80, 96, 112, 128 or 140 packed in four layers.

7. Sour Lemons shall be packed—

- (i)—(a) In "Standard" cases as prescribed in paragraph 2 above; or (b) In "Half Standard" cases having an internal height of 15, 16, 17 or 18 cm.; an internal width of 34 cm. and an external length of 68 cm.; or
- (ii) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.

8. Sour Lemons shall be packed with the following counts:—
(i) In "Standard" cases with counts of 150, 180, 210, 240, 270, 300 and
336. Count 336 shall be packed in six layers; all other counts
shall be packed in five layers; or
(ii) In "Half-Standard" cases with counts of 90, 108, 126, 144, 162,
180, and 224. Count 224 shall be packed in four layers in cases not
less than 17 cm. in height; all other counts shall be packed in three
layers.
9. Clementines and Mandarines shall be packed—
(i) In cases of the following dimensions:—
Internal height 14 cm.
Internal width 30 cm.
External length $62\frac{1}{2}$ cm.
(ii) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.
PART II.—GRAPES.
10. Grapes intended for export to any destination sahll be packed in one

47 of the Regulations and also with the following specifications:

17.—(1) Ware Potatoes intended for export to any destination other than ports of the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea or the Persian Gulf or to Aden shall be packed in one of the following manners:

(i) In wooden cases as prescribed in clause 16 (1) (i) above; or

(ii) In new small baskets as prescribed in clause 16 (1) (iii) above; or (iii) In new hessian bags, the contents of which shall be of a standard gross weight of 25 kilos (56 lbs.); or

(iv) In wooden crates of any dimensions approved by the Director; or (v) In cartons of specifications and dimensions approved by the Director.

(2) Ware Potatoes intended for export to ports of the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea or the Persian Gulf or to Aden, and not intended for transhipment to any other destination, may be packed in any of the manners prescribed in paragraph 17 (1) above or in one of the following manners:

(i) In new hessian bags, the contents of which shall be of a standard gross weight of 50 kilos (112 lbs.); or

(ii) In new large baskets having the specifications and dimensions set out in Regulation 5 (4) (ii) of the Regulations.

(3) Ware Potatoes packed in baskets shall be protected with wood wool or a similar material at the top and bottom of the baskets.

18. All cases and baskets used in the export of potatoes shall be lined with paper.

PART VI.—ONIONS.

19. Onions intended for export to any destination other than ports of the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea or the Persian Gulf or to Aden, and onion picklers and onion sets intended for export to any destination shall be packed in one of the following manners:

(i) In well ventilated wooden cases or crates or trays conforming with the provisions of Regulation 5 of the Regulations, of any dimensions approved by the Director, provided that onion picklers and onion sets shall be packed in bags within the case, crate or tray, as the

(ii) In new open mesh bags or new netting bags of a standard gross weight of 25 kilos (56 lbs.).

20. Onions intended for export to ports of the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea or the Persian Gulf or to Aden, provided they are not intended for transhipment to other destination, may alternatively be packed in new open bags or new netting bags of a gross weight not exceeding 50 kilos (112 lbs.).

#### PART VII.—REVOCATION.

21. The notices set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
