THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, Waman Addition of the control 1939 TO 1959.

Proclamation under Section 3 (1).

Whereas by section 3 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") the provisions of Part II of the Order shall have effect in any territory in which they shall from time to time, in case of any public emergency, be brought into operation by Proclamation made by the Governor;

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 26th day of November, P. I.: 1955, the Governor declared that the provisions of Part II of the Order should have effect in the Colony on and from the said date;

And whereas it is further provided by sub-section (1) of section 3 aforesaid of the Order as amended by the Emergency Powers (Amendment) Order in Council, 1956, that upon the provisions of Part II of the Order coming into operation they shall continue in operation until the Governor by a further Proclamation directs that they shall cease to have effect whereupon they shall cease to have effect except as respects things previously done or omitted to be done:

And whereas the public emergency giving rise to the making of the Proclamation of the 26th November, 1955, aforesaid has ceased to exist in the Colony and it is accordingly considered desirable that the provisions of Part II of the Order aforesaid shall cease to have effect in the Colony:

Now, therefore, I, Hugh Mackintosh Foot, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do by this Proclamation direct that the aforesaid provisions of Part II of the Order shall cease to have effect in the Colony.

THE ELECTIONS (PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC) LAW, 1959.

DECLARATION OF ELECTION OF CANDIDATE UNDER SECTION 17.

Whereas by section 17 of the Elections (President and Vice-President of the Republic) Law, 1959, it is, *inter alia*, provided that if on the day of nomination, after the expiration of the time appointed for nomination, and after the disposal of any objections under section 13, only one candidate stands nominated for the office of Vice-President, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the nominated candidate to be elected and shall forthwith cause the name of the person so elected to be published in the *Gazette*;

And whereas on the day of nomination, after the expiration of the time appointed for nomination (there being no objections under section 13) only Dr. Fazil Mehmet Kutchuk stood nominated for the office of the Vice-President, I, Zafer Ali Zihni, have declared the nominated candidate, namely the aforesaid Dr. Fazil Mehmet Kutchuk, to be elected and hereby cause his name to be published in the *Gazette* accordingly.
