After the giving of the acknowledgment by the Commissioner of No prothe District no proceedings shall be taken against the person whose acknowoffence has been so compounded in respect of that offence; and the production of the acknowledgment before any Court of Justice shall be sufficient evidence that the offence has been compounded under this Law.
