TO MAKE PROVISION FOR REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT A.D. 1926. TO THE SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND AS TO LIFE- 19 of 1926. SAVING APPLIANCES ON SHIPS IN CYPRUS WATERS.

BE it enacted:-

1. This Law may be cited as the Shipping (Regulations Short title. as to Safety) Law, 1926.

2. The Governor in Council may make regulations with Governor regard to all or any of the following matters, namely:— may make regulations

- (a) the number and description of the boats, life- in respect of the safety of boats, life-rafts, life-jackets, and life-buoys to be passengers carried by Cyprus Ships, according to the mode of their ships. construction, also the equipments to be carried by the boats and rafts, and the methods to be provided to get the boats and other life-saving appliances into the water which methods may include oil for use in stormy weather:
- (b) the quantity, quality, and description of buoyant apparatus to be carried on board Cyprus Ships carrying passengers, either in addition to or in substitution for boats, life-boats, life-rafts, life-jackets, and lifebuoys;
- (c) the maximum number of passengers to be carried on board Cyprus Ships.

Regulations to apply to Foreign Ships. 3. The Regulations made under the provisions of section 2 hereof shall apply to all Foreign Ships while they are within any port of Cyprus as they apply to Cyprus Ships: Provided that the Governor may by Order in Council direct that those provisions shall not apply to any Ship of a foreign country in which the provisions in force relating to life-saving appliances and the safety of passengers appear to the Governor to be as effective as the provisions of the Regulations made under section 2 hereof, on proof that those provisions are complied with in the case of that ship.

Saving for foreign ships coming into Cyprus port under stress of weather. 4. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Law shall affect any foreign ship not bound to a port of Cyprus which comes into any port of Cyprus for any purpose other than the purpose of embarking or landing passengers, or taking in or discharging cargo.

Duties of owners and masters in carrying life-saving appliances. 5. It shall be the duty of the owner and master of every ship to see that his ship is provided, in accordance with the regulations for life-saving appliances, with such of those appliances as, having regard to the nature of the service on which the ship is employed, and the avoidance of undue encumbrance of the ship's deck, are best adapted for securing the satety of her crew and passengers subject always to the reservation in the case of Foreign Ships in section 3 hereof mentioned.

6. In the case of any ship-

(a) if the ship is required by the regulations for lifesaving appliances to be provided with such appliances and proceeds on any voyage or excursion without being so provided in accordance with the regulations applicable to the ship; or

(b) if any of the appliances with which the Ship is so provided are lost or rendered unfit for service in the course of the voyage or excursion through the wilful

fault or negligence of the owner or master; or

(c) if the master wilfully neglects to replace or repair on the first opportunity any such appliances lost or injured in the course of the voyage or excursion; or

(d) if such appliances are not kept so as to be at all

times fit and ready for use; or

(e) if the master wilfully carries passengers in excess of the number allowed under the provisions of the regulations;

then the owner of the ship (if in fault) and the master of the ship (if in fault) shall for each offence be liable on conviction before a Magisterial Court to a fine of ten pounds.

7. In this Law-

Definitions.

"Cyprus Ship" means a ship registered under the provisions of the Cyprus Registration of Ships Law, 1922. "Foreign Ship" means a ship other than a "Cyprus

Ship."
