

(4) Any person who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any rules made under this Law, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, and in case of a continuing offence such person shall be liable to a further fine not exceeding two pounds for each day during which the offence continues.

6. The Governor in Council may by order make rules to be published in the *Cyprus Gazette* regulating all or any of the following matters in any industrial undertaking in which children or young persons are employed or work :—

Power to Governor in Council to make rules.

- (1) Sanitary conditions including ventilation ;
- (2) Overcrowding ; and
- (3) Health and safety generally.

7. This Law shall come into operation upon a date fixed by notice by the Governor in the *Cyprus Gazette*.

Date of coming into operation.

FOR THE PROTECTION OF FEMALES IN DOMESTIC SERVICE. A.D. 1928.

[May 5, 1928. 18 of 1928.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Protection of Female Domestic Servants Law, 1928. Short title.

2. In this Law :—

“Female Domestic Servant” means and includes any girl of less than eighteen years of age who is employed as a servant, whether remunerated or not, in any household and any girl of less than eighteen years of age so employed under the name of “adopted child.” Interpretation.

3. Every person who, at the date of the coming into operation of this Law, shall have a female domestic servant in his employment shall register such female domestic servant in the prescribed manner within one month of the coming into operation of this Law. Registration.

No person to have an unregistered female domestic servant in his employment.

4. Subject to the period aforesaid allowed for registration, no person shall have in his employment an unregistered female domestic servant.

An employer of a female domestic servant shall report determination of employment of such servant at the nearest Police Station.

5. Any person who shall have in his employment a female domestic servant shall, at least seven days prior to the date of determination of his employment of such female domestic servant, or forthwith, if such female domestic servant shall leave his employment for any cause, report the matter to the officer in charge of the nearest Police Station.

On the receipt of such a report the officer aforesaid shall have power to take such female domestic servant under his charge and shall thereupon deal with her in accordance with the provisions of Regulations made under this Law.

Penalty.

6. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Law or of any regulations made thereunder shall be liable upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

Power to Governor in Council to make Regulations.

7. The Governor in Council may by order make Regulations :—

(a) Appointing persons to be Registrars for the purposes of this Law ;

(b) Prescribing the form of register to be kept and regulating the registration of female domestic servants ;

(c) Regarding the mode of dealing with female domestic servants under section 5 of this Law ;

(d) Generally for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the purposes or provisions of this Law.

Application of this Law.

8. This Law shall be in force within the Municipal limits of the towns of Nicosia, Kyrenia, Famagusta, Larnaca, Limassol and Paphos, provided that the Governor in Council may by order to be published in the *Cyprus Gazette* apply the Law to any other town or village in the Colony, or may by order make the Law of general application in the Colony.

Date of coming into operation.

9. This Law shall come into operation upon a date fixed by notice by the Governor in the *Cyprus Gazette*.
