BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Advocates (Amendment) Law, 1928, and shall be read as one with the Advocates Law, 1894, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Advocates (Amendment) Law, 1926 and the Principal Law and the said Law and this Law may together be cited as the Advocates Laws, 1894 to 1928. Short title.

2. The Principal Law, section 6, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :— Amendment of Law 12 of 1894, sec. 6.

Provided that no such admission or permit to practise shall be deemed sufficient unless based upon a legal diploma, obtained otherwise than by correspondence, of a University or Law School in the country in question and that if the Legal Board is not satisfied in this regard it may refuse to grant its certificate.

3. This Law shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1926. Date of coming into operation.

TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS. A.D. 1928.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Births and Deaths Registration (Amendment) Law, 1928, and shall be read as one with the Births and Deaths Registration Law, 1895, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Births and Deaths Registration Laws, 1895 and 1928. Short title.

2. The Principal Law, section 7, is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following section shall have effect :— Repeal of Law 16 of 1895, sec. 7, and substitution of new section.

7. Where the birth of any child has been registered and the name, if any, by which it was registered is altered, or if it was registered without a name, when a name is given to it, the father or mother or guardian of the child or other person procuring the name to be altered Compulsory registration of alteration of name of child or of name of child.

or given, shall, within twelve months of the date of birth if the name is altered or given within that period or within six months of the date on which the name is altered or given if altered or given after the aforesaid period of twelve months, give to the Registrar the necessary particulars thereof and shall require the Registrar to amend the registration by altering or adding the name of the child, and the Register shall be amended accordingly, and the alteration or addition shall be initialled by the person procuring the amendment.

Addition of new section.

3. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 20 thereof as section 20 (a) :—

Penalty for omitting or neglecting or refusing to give information to the Registrar.

20 (a). If any person required or directed by this Law to give information to the Registrar of any of the particulars required to be known and registered touching any child born alive or any person dead, or touching the name of any child when the birth of such child has been registered, shall omit or neglect or refuse so to do, every person so offending shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

Amendment of Law 16 of 1895, sec. 21.

4. The Principal Law, section 21, is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "1cp." in line 8 and the substitution therefor of the words "3cp."

Amendment of Law 16 of 1895, sec. 22.

5. The Principal Law, section 22, is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "1cp." in line 3 and the substitution therefor of the words "4½cp."

Special provisions respecting compulsory registration of alteration of name of child or of name of child born within a certain period.

6.—(1) Where the birth of any child born alive in the Colony of Cyprus between the 5th day of November, 1914, and the date of the passing of this Law has been registered and the name, if any, by which it was registered has been altered, or if it was registered without a name, when a name has been given to it, the father or mother or guardian of the child, or other person who has procured the name to be altered or given, shall, within twelve months of the passing of this Law, give to the Registrar the necessary particulars thereof and shall require the Registrar to amend the registration by altering or adding the name of the child, and the Register shall be amended accordingly, and the alteration or addition shall be initialled by the person procuring the amendment.

Penalty.

(2) Any person offending against any of the provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.
