BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1930, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise Regulation Law, 1879, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1924, the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1927, the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment, No. 2) Law, 1927, the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1928, and the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment, No. 2) Law, 1928, and the Principal Law and the said Laws and this Law may together be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulation Laws, 1879 to 1930. Short title.

2. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Law as section 61:— Addition of new section.

61. (1) The exportation of animals, other than dogs and poultry, is hereby prohibited save under a Health Certificate issued by the Government Veterinary Surgeon, or a Stock Inspector or the Health Officer at the Port of embarkation. Exportation of animals.

(2) Any person exporting or attempting to export animals save as provided by this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and all such animals exported or attempted to be exported shall be liable to forfeiture. Penalties.

(3) (i.) The Governor in Council may by order make regulations to be published in the *Cyprus Gazette* for carrying out the purposes of this section. Power to Governor in Council to make regulations.

(ii.) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such regulations may—

(a) Prescribe the place and manner in which animals shall be kept under observation prior to exportation and the period for which they shall be so kept;

(b) Provide for the payment of expenses which may be deemed necessary for carrying into effect the provisions of this section; and

(c) Prescribe the form of and the fees to be paid for Health Certificates under sub-section (1) of this section and the fees to be paid for lairage of animals kept under observation prior to exportation: Provided that such fees shall not exceed the fees specified in the fourth schedule to this Law.

3. The following schedule shall be inserted in the principal Law as fourth schedule:—

FOURTH SCHEDULE (SEC. 61).

1. The fees to be paid for Health Certificates shall not exceed:—

(a) For every horse, mule, donkey, camel, ox or pig one shilling per animal, and

(b) For every sheep or goat or other animal not enumerated in (a) two piastres per animal.

2. The fees to be paid for lairage of animals kept under observation prior to exportation shall not exceed for every twenty-four hours or part thereof:—

(a) For every horse, mule, donkey, camel, ox or pig one piastre per animal, and

(b) For every sheep or goat or other animal not enumerated in (a) half piastre per animal.

4. This Law shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by notice in the *Cyprus Gazette*.
