A LAW TO REGULATE THE FLYING OF FLAGS.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Flags (Prohibition) Law, 1931.

Prohibition
of the
carrying and
flying of
flags.

2. No person shall carry or display or fly or cause or suffer or permit to be displayed or flown in any place or on any building any flag, banner, streamer, pennant or other similar emblem or thing:

Provided that this Law shall not apply to flags, banners, streamers or pennants which,

(a) are flown by His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces, or

(b) are authorized to be flown by the Governor, or

(c) are flown by any duly accredited Consul or Consular Agent, or

(d) are flown on any ship or boat in accordance with the provisions of any Act of the Imperial Parliament or of any Cyprus Law or of any rule or regulation made respectively thereunder, or

(e) are flown on any foreign ship in order to indicate the nationality of such ship.

Penalty.

3. Any person contravening the provisions of this Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall on summary conviction be liable to imprisonment for any term not exceeding twelve months or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to both such punishments, and in addition to any such punishment the Court may order that any flag, banner, streamer or pennant carried or flown in contravention of this Law shall be forfeited to His Majesty.

4. This Law shall come into operation upon its publication in the *Cyprus Gazette*.
