A LAW FURTHER TO AMEND THE POLICE
LAWS, 1878 TO 1932.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Police (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Police Laws, 1878 to 1932, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Police Laws, 1878 to 1933.

Amendment

2. Section 4 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following provisoes:—

“ Provided that the Chief Commandant may discharge any Non-Commissioned Officer or Private at any time during the currency of his engagement—

(a) if pronounced by a Government Medical Officer or by any Medical Board appointed to enquire into the state of his health, mentally or physically unfit for further service,

(b) on reduction of establishment, and may discharge any Private at any time during the currency of his engagement if the Chief Commandant shall consider he is unlikely to become an efficient Private:

Provided further that in any case where the Chief Commandant desires to discharge, on reduction of establishment, any Non-Commissioned Officer or Private with more than five years total service, such discharge shall be subject to the approval of the Governor and shall not take effect until approved by him."

3. Sub-section (1) of section 26 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor:—

Repeal of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the Principal Law and substitution of new sub-section.

"(1) Where any Non-Commissioned Officer or Private has served in the force for any term exceeding one year and less than twenty years, and

(a) has on his discharge been pronounced by a Government Medical Officer or by any Medical Board appointed to enquire into the state of his health, mentally or physically unfit for further service, or

(b) is being discharged on reduction of establishment, a gratuity computed at the rate of thirty days' pay for each completed year of service may be granted to him."

This Law came into operation on 27th January, 1933.
