BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Identification of Prisoners (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Identification of Prisoners Law, 1917, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Identification of Prisoners Laws, 1917 and 1933.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

"Photo-  
graphs and  
measure-  
ments of  
convicted  
prisoners.

2. A person convicted of any offence punishable with imprisonment may be photographed and measured at any time during his imprisonment by a police officer authorized for that purpose by the Chief Commandant of Police."

3. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 7 of the following sections:—

"Central  
Register to  
be kept.

8.—(1) There shall be kept by and under the management of the Chief Commandant of Police or any person appointed by him for that purpose a register, to be called and hereinafter in this section referred to as "the Central Register", in such form as the Chief Commandant of Police may from time to time prescribe.

Particulars  
to be  
recorded in  
Central  
Register.

(2) The Central Register shall contain the following particulars relative to each person recorded therein—

- (a) name, age and sex;
- (b) family antecedents;
- (c) last known address;
- (d) photographs;
- (e) measurements;
- (f) convictions.

Prisoners to whom Central Register shall relate.

(3) The Central Register shall relate to prisoners convicted of—

- (a) all offences triable on Information, and
- (b) such other offences, triable summarily, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.

Local Register.

9.—(1) There shall be kept by and under the management of every Local Commandant of Police in charge of a District a register, to be called and in this section referred to as “the Local Register”, in such form as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.

Contents thereof.

(2) The Local Register shall—  
 (a) relate to prisoners convicted of such offences triable summarily, and  
 (b) contain such particulars, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.”

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 and 1932, (hereinafter called the “Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 to 1933. 2. The definition of “Property” in section 2 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following definition substituted therefor :— Amendment of section 2 of Law 12 of 1930.
