BE it enacted:—

Short title.

24 of 1922.

1. This Law may be cited as the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, 1922, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933.

Insertion of new sections 11 and 12 in Law 24 of 1922. 2. The following sections are hereby inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 10:—

"Alien practitioner without permit not entitled to recover fees.

11. Notwithstanding anything in the Medical Registration Law, 1917, to the contrary contained, no alien medical practitioner, not being a missionary or employé or member of a recognized society, shall be entitled in any Court to recover any charge for any medical or surgical advice or attendance or for the performance of any operation or for any medicine which he has prescribed and supplied unless he was at the relevant date in possession of a permit under this Law.

Offences and penalties.

12.—(1) Any person who engages in philanthropic, educational or medical work in contravention of this Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both.

(2) In any case in which a person is convicted of having engaged in medical work without being in possession of a permit under this Law the Registrar of the Court before which he has been convicted shall forward a certified copy of the conviction to the Registrar appointed under section 5 of the Medical Registration Law, 1917, or any amendment thereof, who shall thereupon erase from the Medical Register the name of such convicted person if his name appears therein.

This Law came into operation on 27th October, 1933.
