A LAW TO AMEND THE IMMIGRATION LAWS,
1936 TO 1938.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) Law, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Immigration Laws, 1936 to 1938, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Immigration Laws, 1936 to 1939.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion of the definition of “native of the Colony” contained therein and by the substitution therefor of the following definition:—

“‘native of the Colony’ means any person who is a British subject and—

(a) was born in the Colony or of parents who at the time of his birth were ordinarily resident in the Colony; or

(b) obtained the status of a British subject by virtue of the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council, 1914 to 1929, or by reason of the grant by the Governor

- of a certificate of naturalization under the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914; or
- (c) is the wife of a person to whom any of the foregoing paragraphs applies not living apart from such person under a decree of a competent Court or of a deed of separation; or
- (d) is a child, step-child or adopted child having been adopted in a manner recognized by law, under the age of eighteen years, of a person to whom any of the foregoing paragraphs applies.”
