A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION OF SAGE LEAVES.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Sage Leaves (Protection) Law, 1942. Short title.

2. In this Law—

“sage” means the plants *Salvia cypria*, Kotschy, *Salvia triloba* L and *Salvia grandiflora* Etling.

Interpretation.

3.—(1) No person shall gather leaves from sage except during such period as may be fixed by order of the Governor in Council :

Gathering of sage leaves prohibited except during periods fixed by Governor in Council.

Provided that nothing in this sub-section shall apply to the uprooting of sage on any land for the purpose of cultivating such land.

(2) Any person who gathers leaves from sage except in the period fixed under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month or to a fine not exceeding five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.
