A LAW TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS,
1930 TO 1943.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Municipal Corporations (Amendment) (No. 2) Law, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to (No. 2) 1943.

2. Sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (p) of section 116 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one piastre" (line 7) and the substitution therefor of the words "two piastres".

3. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 184 of the following section:—

"Councils to
have power
to fix fees by
bye-laws.

184A. Notwithstanding anything in this Law contained any council may, with the approval of the Governor, make bye-laws fixing the fees to be paid for the weighing, measuring or testing of goods as provided in section 184 hereof and upon the making of such bye-laws the fees payable under the provisions of the said section shall be the fees set forth in such bye-laws in lieu of the fees set forth in the twelfth schedule hereto and the twelfth schedule hereto shall cease to apply to any such goods weighed, measured or tested within the municipal limits within which the council making such bye-laws operates."

4. Sub-section (1) of section 189 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the addition thereto at the end thereof of the following proviso:—

"Provided that where any council has made bye-laws under the provisions of section 184A hereof the fees payable under the provisions of this section shall be the fees set forth in such bye-laws in lieu of the fees set forth in the twelfth schedule as aforesaid."

5. The ninth schedule to the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following schedule substituted therefor:—
