### No. 32 OF 1948.

A LAW FURTHER TO AMEND THE GOATS LAWS, 1913 TO 1937.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Goats (Amendment) Short title.  
Law, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Goats Laws, 1913 to 1937 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Goats Laws, 1913 to 1948.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 2 of the following section:—

“Alteration  
of boundaries  
of prescribed  
village.

2A.—(1) Whenever the boundaries of a prescribed village are altered—

(a) any new area or lands added to the area or lands of such village shall be deemed to be included in, and form part of, such prescribed village without any further order;

(b) any area or lands taken out of the area or lands of such village shall cease to form part of such prescribed village without any further order;

(2) This section shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st June, 1948.”

3. Section 5 of the principal Law (as amended by Law 31 of 1935) is hereby further amended by the insertion therein of the following words immediately after the words “in the said village” at the end thereof:—

“and a certificate under the hand of the Commissioner certifying the posting, shall be deemed to be conclusive evidence of such posting”.

4. Sub-section (1) of section 11 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor:—

“(1) If any goat or kid is found in any prescribed village contrary to the provisions of section 6 of this Law, both the owner of such goat or kid and the person, if any, in whose charge it was at the time shall be guilty of an offence against this Law and shall, on conviction, be adjudged to pay one shilling for every goat or kid in respect of which the offence has been committed and every such goat or kid shall be forfeited:

Provided that nothing in this section shall apply—

(a) to any goat or kid in the possession of the officer in charge for the purposes of section 10;

(b) to any goat or kid brought into any such village for the purpose of slaughter:

Provided, however, that such goat or kid shall be slaughtered within eight days from the day on which the same was brought into the village and that such goat or kid is in the meantime kept confined or tethered.”

5. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 11A (inserted by Law 31 of 1935) of the following section :—

Insertion of new section 11B in the principal Law.

“Forfeiture of equivalent number of goats or kids in certain cases.

11B. Notwithstanding anything in this Law contained, whenever any goats or kids are forfeited under the provisions of this Law and for any reason the identification of the goats or kids in respect of which the offence has been committed is not possible or practicable, there shall be forfeited instead thereof an equivalent number of goats or kids being the property of the person convicted.”

6. Sub-section (3) of section 14 of the principal Law (as set out in Law 7 of 1937) is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor :—

Repeal of section 14 (3) of the principal Law and substitution of new sub-section.

“(3) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (4), a person upon whom a notice has been served under sub-section (1) shall not, as from the date of the service of such notice, sell, slaughter, part with or otherwise dispose of, any goat or kid, to which the notice relates, until after the expiration of ten days from the date on which he is convicted in any criminal proceedings which may be instituted against him in connection with the offence alleged in the notice.”

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Bank Holidays (Amendment) Law, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Bank Holidays Law, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Bank Holidays Laws, 1928 and 1948. Short title.
