A Law to amend the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Irrigation Divisions short title. (Villages) (Amendment) Law, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 11 of 1938 1944 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 to 1949.

Amendment of section 13 of the principal Law.

- 2. Section 13 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following sub-section, the present part of the said section being numbered as sub-section (1):—
 - "(2) For the purpose of securing the payment of the principal and interest of any loan, a Committee shall have and shall be deemed always to have had the power to mortgage to the lender any irrigation works or other property of the irrigation division and any rates or charges payable under the provisions of this Law."

Insertion of new section 22A in the principal Law. 3. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 22 of the following section:—

"Loans to become due and payable on dissolution.

- 22A.—(1) Upon the dissolution of an irrigation division and notwithstanding anything contained in this Law or any rules made thereunder, the whole of any loan or advance and every instalment thereof then due and owing by or on behalf of such irrigation division and whether made under this Law or under any of the repealed Laws (whilst such Laws were in force) shall become due and payable to the lender.
- (2) For the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section—

11 of 1887 1 of 1931 17 of 1934 'repealed Laws' means the Irrigation and Water Law, 1887, and the Irrigation Laws, 1931 and 1934.''
