A LAW TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 то 1948.

) E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :-

1. This Law may be cited as the Municipal Corporations Short title. (Amendment) Law, 1950, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1948 (hereinafter 26 of 1930 referred to as "the principal Law") and the principal Law $\frac{23}{29}$ of $\frac{1942}{1942}$ and this Law may together be cited as the Municipal 12 of 1943 Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1950.

Insertion of new section 79a in the principal Law. 2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 79, of the following section:—

"Power to Governor in Council to declare a council as having expired.

79A. If any council fails to perform any duty or to enforce any provision of this Law, in respect of which the Governor in Council has made an order under section 79 hereof by the time limited in such order, the Governor in Council, notwithstanding anything in this Law contained and notwithstanding any proceedings taken for the purpose of enforcing any such order, may declare such council to have expired and the councillors thereof to have vacated their office and, thereupon, appoint a municipal commission which shall have all the powers and shall perform all the duties of the council which has so expired until such time, not exceeding the unexpired period of office of that council, as the Governor in Council may direct and also appoint from the members of such commission a Chairman and a Deputy Chairman who, during the same time, shall have all the powers and shall perform all the duties of a mayor and a deputy mayor, respectively."

Commencement. 3. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1950.
