THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 21 OF 1951.

A LAW TO AMEND THE FISHERIES LAWS, 1931 AND 1944.

Governor.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Fisheries (Amendment) Law, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Fisheries Laws, 1931 and 1944 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Fisheries Laws, 1931 to 1951.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, in its proper alphabetical order, of the following definition :—

“ ‘ trawler ’ means a vessel which, for the purpose of taking fish, draws a net or other apparatus along the bottom of the sea ; ”

3. Sub-section (2) of section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ to a fine not exceeding ten pounds ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ to imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine ”.

4. Section 6 of the principal Law is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the insertion in sub-section (2), immediately after paragraph (e), of the following paragraphs (the full stop at the end thereof being replaced by a semicolon) :—

“ (f) provide for the limitation by the Comptroller of the number of licences to be issued in any year to trawlers, and the selection of applicants to whom such licences may be issued where the number of applications exceed the limited number of the licences and prescribe the conditions to be attached to such licences ;

(g) regulate any other matter relating to the conservation, protection and maintenance of a stock of fish which may be deemed requisite.” ;

(b) by the deletion in sub-section (3) of the words “ to a fine not exceeding ten pounds ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ to imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.”
