A LAW TO AMEND THE BREWERIES LAW, 1950.

Governor.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Breweries (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Breweries Law, 1950 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Breweries Laws, 1950 and 1954.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 11, of the following section :—

"Days and
hours of
work.

11A.—(1) The days and hours during which any premises may be open for the manufacture of beer or for any other purpose shall be such as may be approved by the Comptroller, but so that the ordinary hours of duty per week of any Officer performing duty therein shall not exceed those prescribed for Customs officers under the Customs Law, or any Law amending or substituted for the same.

(2) Overtime work outside such approved days and hours may be permitted by the Collector of Customs upon written application by the brewer concerned and payment by him of fees at such rates and under such conditions as may be prescribed under the Customs Law, or any Law amending or substituted for the same."
