A LAW TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE SECURITY OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND FOR SEARCHING OF PERSONS ENTERING THEREIN AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH AND SIMILAR THERETO.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Public Buildings (Security) Law, 1955.

Short title.

2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“means of conveyance” means any animal, carriage, railway waggon, bicycle, motor vehicle of any description or any other vehicle used for the purpose of conveyance of persons or goods;

“public building” means any building belonging to, or for the time being used by, the Government or Her Majesty’s Forces, or any Department or branch thereof, and includes any building belonging to, or used by, any statutory body or authority, or any corporation, company or other person performing a public utility service.

3. Without prejudice to any other powers conferred by any other Law and notwithstanding anything in any other Law contained, no person shall—

Restriction on entry into public buildings and on passing police or military barriers.

(a) enter any public building, or

(b) pass any barrier set up at any place by the Police Force or by Her Majesty’s Forces,

unless he first submits, if required so to do by any police officer or any member of Her Majesty’s Forces, to a search, by such police officer or such member of Her Majesty’s Forces, of his person, and of anything carried by or on him, and of any means of conveyance accompanying him.

A LAW TO AMEND THE EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY LAW. CAP. 111

Enacted by His Excellency the Governor and the Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Employers' Liability (Amendment) Law, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Employers' Liabilities Law (hereinafter referred to as the Law).
