A LAW TO AMEND THE EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES LAW. CAP. 83.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :-

1. This Law may be cited as the Explosive Substances Short title. (Amendment) Law, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Explosive Substances Law (hereinafter referred to as "the Cap. 83. principal Law").

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Law.

- 2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, in its proper alphabetical place, of the following definition:—
 - "'Inspector of Explosives' means the Inspector of Explosives appointed under section 3 and includes an Assistant Inspector of Explosives appointed under the said section;".

Repeal of section 3 of the principal Law and substitution of new section. 3. Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

"Appointment of Inspector of Explosives and Assistant Inspectors of Explosives. 3. The Governor may appoint a fit and proper person to be Inspector of Explosives under this Law and may appoint such number of Assistant Inspectors of Explosives as he may deem fit.".

Amendment of section 4 of the principal Law.

- 4. Section 4 of the principal Law is hereby amended as follows:
 - (a) by the addition at the end of sub-section (4) thereof of the following proviso (the full stop at the end of the said sub-section being substituted by a colon):—

"Provided that the provisions of paragraph (d) of this sub-section shall not apply to any fireworks.";

(b) by the insertion in paragraph (c) of sub-section (6) thereof, immediately after the words "fifty rounds" (line 1), of the words and brackets "(or in lieu of such cartridges two hundred drams of gunpowder and two hundred and fifty percussion caps)".
