APPLIANCES ON CERTAIN VEHICLES.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Bulb Horns and Whistles Prohibition Law.

Prohibition

2. No person riding, driving or in charge of any bicycle or any vehicle other than a motor car or motor cycle shall carry thereon or sound any bulb horn, whistle, or any other appliance adapted for the making of an audible sound except only a bell.

Prohibition
of use of
certain bells
on bicycles.

3. No person shall use, possess or sell a bicycle fitted with a bell which is operated by means of contact direct or indirect with either of the wheels of the bicycle or which can be operated so as to ring continuously without movement of the fingers.

Penalties.

4. Any person acting in contravention of this Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred mils and the appliance in respect of which the offence has been committed shall be forfeited.
